




5 steps to start making presentations visually accessible

Check your colors to ensure they **meet AA standards at minimum**



Ensure **minimum contrast ratios are met** as you create graphics



Maintain **legible text sizes** (relative to your final delivery method)



Run **colorblindness checks** on all charts and graphics
